The second semester will focus on typing skills. Laptops for use in class will be provided by the Curve. Students will be assigned a little bit of optional homework each week.

Algebra I

Students will be issued a drawing journal and will make weekly additions of drawings and facts about cryptids and mythical monsters from around the world.

Health 8th-12th

This full-year course provides students with a solid understanding of health, wellness, and physical fitness. Students are encouraged to think critically about health-related topics, particularly those about which there is conflicting information in the media, and will practice evaluating the credibility of sources. Course topics include mental health, stress, anatomy, the systems of the body, reproduction and sexuality, nutrition, relationships, drugs and alcohol, diseases, and personal safety. Estimated work outside of class: 1 hr/week. This class will meet the .5 credit requirement for high school health.

Interior Design

This class will not assign weekly homework, but may assign occasional projects for students to complete at home.

Jam Band

In our Jam Band class, students will experience the thrill of playing in a real band, learning how to collaborate and perform music together. The class will cover essential topics like rhythm, harmony, dynamics, and stage presence, helping students understand how all the instruments come together to create powerful, energetic performances. Students should have some experience playing their instrument of choice, but all levels are encouraged to participate. By the end of the course, students will have the confidence and experience to perform as a cohesive band, ready to rock out in front of an audience at our Curve Spring Performing Arts Showcase!

Language Arts 6-8th

Stories have lasting power: power to teach, power to heal, power to inspire, and power to transform. In this class, middle school students will encounter the power of stories in various genres like memoir/biography, historical fiction, fantasy/sci-fi, realism, and poetry. We will read books and discuss and analyze them, write personal reflections about them, and create our own stories through journaling. Students will have quarterly major projects in which they will write their own stories: one-pager book report, 3-paragraph essay, speech with research, and personal narrative. This class will include vocabulary, grammar, and poetry as well. Students will do 2-3 hours of homework outside of class and will need to use Google Classroom.

Language Arts 9-12th

Find your voice and learn to use it well—your voice matters! This language arts class will include reading, writing, vocabulary, and grammar. Students will write weekly one-paragraph personal reflections or literary analyses. Four larger projects/essays will be due quarterly. Class time each week will be centered around discussion as we learn how to read deeply, think widely, and express ourselves distinctly. Grammar will be completed through weekly lessons online. Students will do up to 3 hours of homework outside of class and will need to use Google Classroom. This course is designed to satisfy one high school English credit.

Math 6/7

In our Middle School Math class, students will explore key mathematical concepts that build the foundation for success in higher-level math. The class will cover a range of topics including operations with fractions, decimals, and percentages, as well as basic geometry, algebraic thinking, and data analysis. Through interactive lessons, hands-on activities, and real-world problem-solving, students will develop strong critical thinking and reasoning skills. This class meets twice per week on both Monday and Wednesday. To help reinforce what we've learned, there will be assignments that you will complete at home with your parents. Our instructor will also be available by email for any parent questions. By the end of the course, students will feel more confident in their math abilities and ready to tackle new concepts in the years ahead!

Mock Trial 9th-12th

In Mock Trial, students will learn how to understand, plan, and lead a trial in an actual courtroom as either attorneys or witnesses in cases written by the Tennessee Bar Association. Students will learn how to make opening and closing statements, write direct and cross-examinations, how to utilize rules of evidence, and how to act in character as a witness from an official affidavit. Members of this class should be prepared to be available for the Davidson County competition (usually the last Friday and Saturday in February), the State competition on the last Friday and Saturday in March, and the same in April. This is a high school only class. Per the competition rules, students must be in grades 9-12 to participate. Estimated work outside of class: 1 hr or less/week. Teacher: Jansen Gibson Cost: \$800/yr Supply Fee: \$40/yr

Musical Theater

Join us for a full musical theater show! Each semester will be filled with learning scripts, music, choreography, blocking, costume and set creation and will end with a full performance. Students in 3rd-12th grade are eligible to participate. Everyone who signs up will be in the show! Auditions for roles will be held on the first day of class. (Audition prep information will be emailed out ahead of time.) Weekly rehearsal is a 2 hour block and students must be present weekly. There will be additional rehearsals called the week of the show as well. Students will be expected to practice their lines and music at home outside of class. Cost: \$800/yr Supply Fee: \$120/yr



Photography & Yearbook Design (Middle & High School)

In this creative and collaborative class, students will dive into the world of photography and yearbook design, learning how to capture memories and tell stories that matter. From mastering photography basics like composition, lighting, and editing to designing eye-catching yearbook pages, this class combines hands-on learning with real-world skills. Students will explore different photography techniques, work with digital tools, and develop their creative vision while collaborating on a project that documents their community. Along the way, they'll learn the art of storytelling through imagery, how to work as part of a team, and how to create something meaningful they can be proud of. Throughout the school year, we'll explore:

Intro to Documentary Photography

- Photography basics, so you can confidently capture amazing images.
- How to work with natural and available light to elevate your photography.
- Capturing authentic moments that tell a story.
- Tips for quickly diversifying your photo options while working on the go.
- Simple editing techniques to polish and enhance your photography.

Design Essentials

- Project management and planning to keep you organized and on track.
- An introduction to graphic design and the principles for creating beautiful, eye-catching layouts.
- Teamwork and collaboration, because yearbook creation is a team effort!

What You'll Need

Students should have basic computer skills (like opening documents, cutting, pasting, etc.) and access to a digital camera and a computer (preferably a laptop you can bring to class). A cell phone camera works great too!

We'll also divide up coverage of the program's major events and classes among yearbook students. All participants should be prepared to commit to some work outside of class time—it's all part of bringing the yearbook to life!

Whether they're new to photography or seasoned shutterbugs, this class will help students build confidence behind the camera and in their creative abilities. By the end, they'll walk away with both technical skills and a keepsake that celebrates their hard work and unique perspective!

By the end of the course, students will have created a finished podcast ready to share with the world, and will have gained valuable skills in teamwork, creativity, and digital media production. Students will need a laptop computer or iPad they can use to record themselves and a pair of basic headphones. You will also need audio editing software like Adobe Audition, although a free tool like Audacity will also work. (The Curve will also have some computers available for loan as needed.) Podcasting projects may involve students doing some interviewing/recording outside of class.

Theater Tech: Behind the Scenes Magic (Middle & High School)

Step into the exciting world of theater production in this hands-on class designed for students who want to create the magic that happens behind the curtain! From building and painting sets to creating props, mastering stage lighting and sound, and exploring basic stage makeup techniques, this class covers it all. Students will work as part of a creative team to bring the school's theatrical productions to life. They'll learn the fundamentals of set construction, design principles, and safe tool use. We'll dive into the art of lighting and sound design to enhance the mood and storytelling of a performance. Plus, they'll get a chance to explore stage makeup, learning techniques to transform actors into their characters. This class is perfect for anyone who loves to build, create, and collaborate. By the end of the year, students will have handson experience in theater production and a chance to see their hard work come to life on stage. Let's make the magic happen! This class will not involve "homework" but students will be invited to attend tech week rehearsals and performances for our musical theater productions as "stage crew."

Wilderness Survival

Designed for the teens who love being outside! This is an outdoor and hands-on based approach to learning a broad range of skills to navigate the outdoors in emergent and non-emergent situations. This class will lay a foundation of advanced survival skills including building a shelter, using a compass, water filtration, and medical care. No out of class work will be assigned.

Woodworking 101

Students will begin with the use of hand tools and learning the basics of measuring, fastening, and sawing as they create and assemble through our project-based curriculum. They will progress to the use of light power tools, learning to read and create plans for their work, and learning when accuracy matters. In learning to read plans, we focus on how to realize a two-dimensional drawing into a three-dimensional object while incorporating lessons in applied geometry. While part of our goal is to teach students the mechanics of how to create with wood as a primary material, this is really a vehicle for building self-confidence, patience, perseverance, and understanding that making mistakes is part of the learning process.

Woodworking 201

In Woodworking 201, students will build on the skills learned in Woodworking 101, diving deeper into more advanced woodworking techniques and projects. They will refine their use of power tools, learning to safely and effectively operate equipment like drills, routers, and sanders to create more complex and precise pieces. Students will continue developing their ability to read and create detailed plans, with an emphasis on advanced joinery, finishing techniques, and creating custom designs. This course will challenge students to think critically about both the design and construction of their projects while reinforcing the importance of precision and craftsmanship. Through hands-on projects, students will not only strengthen their technical skills but also continue to build problem-solving abilities, creativity, and confidence as they tackle more intricate woodworking challenges. By the end of the course, students will be ready to take on larger, more sophisticated projects with a higher level of skill and expertise. Woodworking 101 is a prerequisite for this class.

World History 8th-12th

Our High School World History course will investigate world history through a variety of historical and cultural anthropological models. Beginning with the dawn of Human Civilization, we will progress through the Age of Empires, the rise and fall of Kingdoms, the birth of the Nation State, and into our modern period. Students will learn what we "factually know" about world history, what we "think" we know about this story, and what we "pretend" to know but truly can't confirm. Additionally, we will learn that the lens of history is rarely objective. We will unpack how versions of the same history, often are documented very differently when comparing the winning and losing sides of the game. Real history isn't about dry "dates" and "facts." Real history is more intriguing. It's gonna get weird. Estimated work assigned outside of class: 2-3 hours. This course will meet the requirements for a full credit hour of high school history.

World Religions/Philosophy 8th-12th

How have different peoples and cultures sought answers to life's biggest questions throughout history? In this class, students will journey through the world's major religions and explore the various philosophical ideas that have shaped human understanding of existence, morality, and communal life. The first semester of this course will cover the world's major religions through studying their foundational beliefs and practices as well as reading excerpts from their sacred texts. Students will get a basic understanding of the timeline of religions in world history. The focus will be academic, seeking to grow in understanding and respect of various belief systems. The second semester will introduce students to the foundational concepts and debates of philosophy. Through a combination of reading, videos, discussion, written reflection, and oration, students will grow in critical thinking skills, practice argumentation and rhetoric, and tackle age-old questions and dilemmas as well as current hot topic debates in logic, metaphysics, ethics, and epistemology. Students will have up to 2-3 hours of homework a week and must use Google Classroom for homework and teacher communication. This class will count as a full humanities or history elective for high school credit.

Yoga/Mindfulness - 6th-12th

This class introduces students to the basics of yoga and mindfulness, providing an engaging space for increased awareness, self-discovery, and overall balance in the mindbody connection. Through a combination of yoga poses, breathing techniques, meditation, and mindfulness exercises, students will learn tools to manage stress, deepen their awareness, and to feel more calm, centered, and confident. By the end of the class, students will be equipped to integrate these skills into their daily lives for greater well-being and resilience. No out of class work will be assigned.

Zoology 6th-8th

Middle School Zoology students will learn about all things animal. We will visit all of Earth's biomes and explore who lives there. Through hands-on activities, projects, and observations, students will study topics including animal classification, life cycles, adaptations and survival in the wild, habitats and ecosystems, food chains and food webs, biodiversity, endangered species and conservation efforts. Estimated work assigned to complete outside of class: 1 hour/week.


